| Early Learning Coalition of Flagler and Volusia Counties | Early Literacy Supports                    | The Home Book Delivery Program fosters early literacy skills in children from birth to age 5. By providing free, monthly access to high quality, age-appropriate books & other resources, the program equips parents and children with essential tools for early literacy development.   | \$22,000     |
| You Thrive   | Achieving Success Through School Readiness | This program helps preschoolers from enrollment through their transition to kindergarten by fostering positive family relationships. School readiness coaches encourage parent involvement, including volunteering in classrooms and participating in center activities. Families are supported with goal-setting, individualized plans and community resources. | \$32,000     |

| Boys & Girls Clubs of Volusia/Flagler Counties | Project Learn                                    | Project Learn is a year-long program to support learning in the clubs after school, on non-school days and holidays for 6- to 18 -year-old students at eight sites in Volusia and Flagler counties. All sites provide a range of high quality services to support student learning and development, including: mentoring, academic enrichment, service learning, character education, physical education & recreational activities and dropout prevention. | \$47,000     |
| CATALYST Global Youth Initiatives**            | Group Mentoring Program*                         | A comprehensive, year-round Group Mentoring Program empowers middle and high school students by providing a holistic and impactful experience through: mentorship, academic enrichment, social-emotional learning, character development, career exploration, community service, life skills development, and summer enrichment.   | \$17,000     |
| Children's Home Society of Florida             | Campbell Middle - A Community Partnership School | The Community Partnership School model puts the right people, resources and services in place to help students overcome challenges, including higher rates of absenteeism, that interfere with students' learning and success. The four main pillars of this model include: expanded learning, wellness support, family and community engagement, and collaborative leadership.  | \$42,000     |
| Flagler County Education Foundation            | Career Coaching to Diploma Plus                  | This program involves collaboration across the Flagler Schools District and industry professionals to ensure that every student exiting high school will graduate with a diploma plus an industry certification, career exposure, experience or educational acceleration that will directly lead to meaningful employment, trade, and/or college.  | \$42,000     |
| PACE Center for Girls Volusia - Flagler        | Academic Support & Counseling                    | The Academic Support & Counseling program in Volusia County addresses the need for interventions that disrupt the cycle of school failure and provide a pathway to academic success.   | \$47,000     |
| The Salvation Army**                           | After School Program Beacon of Hope*             | This program is designed to provide a safe, structured and supportive environment for children in kindergarten through 8th grade. Based in Daytona Beach, the program aims to enrich the lives of children by focusing on academic support, personal growth, and community engagement.   | \$20,000     |

### Financial Stability

#### Families and individuals have access to safe and affordable housing.

| Organization                            | Program  | Program Description  | Funded 25-26 |

| Catholic Charities of Central Florida   | Keeping People in Stable Housing                         | The Volusia County case manager begins with a complete assessment of the household at risk of eviction, foreclosure; or loss of utility services to determine what has led to the crisis situation and how financial assistance can resolve the crisis. Some clients seek assistance with required deposits and first month rent in order to secure stable housing. Other clients seek help with unpaid utility bills which would lead to homelessness without assistance. | \$32,000     |
| Family Renew Community                  | Transitional Housing for Homeless Families with Children | This program provides modest, furnished apartments to homeless families with children, rent-free and with no charge for utilities, while working with them to attain permanent housing. Additionally financial, educational and general case management is provided to resident families.  | \$37,000     |
| First Step Shelter                      | Health and Housing Program                               | First Step Shelter Health and Housing Program addresses two overarching needs: emergency shelter and food and moving shelter residents from homelessness to housing. This is the only single adult emergency shelter in eastern Volusia County. The shelter is open 24/7 and residents aren't required to leave in the morning and return later.   | \$47,000     |
| The Neighborhood Center of West Volusia | The NHCWV SHIFT Program                                  | The SHIFT program provides a continuum of safe and affordable housing including emergency shelter, transitional housing, permanent housing and rapid rehousing solutions to the community in the effort to reduce and end homelessness for individuals and families with children who need immediate temporary shelter, short-term affordable housing and long-term sustainable housing.   | \$47,000     |

#### Families and individuals have access to sustaining income.

| Foundations To Freedom** | Empowering Recovery Peers: Building Strong Community Foundations for Financial Stability* | The goal of this program is to strengthen recovery efforts by providing a structured approach to outreach, engagement and retention in recovery, with a focus on developing Certified Peer Recovery Specialists with lived experiences related to substance use disorder. | \$16,000     |

| Domestic Abuse Council of Volusia County | Economic Justice Program                | The Economic Empowerment Program assists survivors of intimate partner violence in developing the tools needed to work toward financial independence, specifically focusing on financial skills and literacy skills. Financial security is the number one predictor of whether a survivor of intimate partner violence will have the resources to leave and live a life free of abuse. | \$42,000     |
| Flagler Cares                            | Financial and Housing Stability Program | Flagler Cares' Financial & Housing Stability Program is focused on a whole person approach to supporting individuals as they work on their own identified goals. Individuals experiencing housing instability or financial challenges often have an array of needs that are rarely addressed through one program, service or agency.   | \$42,000     |

| Council on Aging of Volusia County                | Elder Services Program             | In-home services provide the basic home care/tasks necessary for seniors to live at home. Meal delivery and neighborhood dining provide a basic need.  | \$47,000     |
| Jewish Federation of Volusia & Flagler Counties** | The Doliner Food Bank*             | Funding will be used to purchase food to be distributed, addressing food insecurity. The food bank serves anyone in the community who needs food, providing up to 10 days of groceries each visit.   | \$20,000     |
| SMA Healthcare                                    | Primary Care Services              | This program provides primary medical services to underserved and vulnerable populations, including the uninsured and those living below the poverty level. This addresses health professional shortage that has been declared for the low-income population in Volusia County for primary care, dental and mental health. | \$27,000     |
| Volusia-Flagler County Coalition for the Homeless | Street Outreach Health Initiative* | This initiative targets the homeless/chronically homeless persons who have been identified as the high utilizers of community resources. This is a step toward developing a street medicine program, a proven strategy across the nation.  | \$27,000     |

| Family Life Center                            | Domestic Violence/Sexual Assault Emergency Services | This is a comprehensive survivor-centered initiative designed to support individuals impacted by intimate partner violence and sexual assault. Services include emergency shelter, advocacy, counseling, legal services and crisis intervention.                                  | \$37,000     |
| Second Harvest Food Bank of Central Florida** | Bring Hope Home*                                    | Through this program, healthy food boxes are delivered to Volusia County residents who screen positive for food insecurity and lack reliable transportation to access food. Target populations include seniors, veterans and individuals with a disability or autoimmune disease. | \$20,000     |

#### Individuals have access to affordable and quality behavioral health services.

| Easterseals Northeast Central Florida | #MIP Empower: Middle School Edition*                    | #MIP Empower is a middle school students experiencing mental health challenges. The program is conducted at Edgar's Farm, blending psychosocial rehabilitation with recreational activities, offering comprehensive mental health support through engaging, hands-on experiences. | \$20,000     |
| IMPOWER**                             | IMPOWERing the Underserved through Telehealth Services* | This program will expand access to outpatient behavioral health services for underserved (uninsured, underinsured) children, adolescents, and adults residing in Volusia and Flagler counties through telehealth services.  | \$16,000     |
| Presbyterian Counseling Center        | Affordable Access- Mental Health & Parenting Support    | This program provides high quality and affordable mental health services and raises awareness of mental health issues and treatment options throughout the community. Services include therapy sessions as well as parenting support classes and interactive groups.              | \$27,000     |
| The House Next Door                   | Specialized Trauma Therapy Services                     | This program provides evidence-based, trauma-informed therapy services, including specialized services for children who have reported sexual abuse, their non-offending caregivers and their affected siblings.   | \$27,000     |
