At 15, Jean was struggling in school and at home. Unhealthy social associations and behaviors caused her grades to plunge and her relationship with her parents to erode. Thanks to her subsequent enrollment in an alternative school program for girls funded by the CF/UWVFC, Jean found a better path. With group, individual and family counseling and intensive academic support over three semesters, Jean pulled her GPA up to top in the class and her confidence along with it. This successful member of the Class of 2026, plans to go to Daytona State College in the fall.

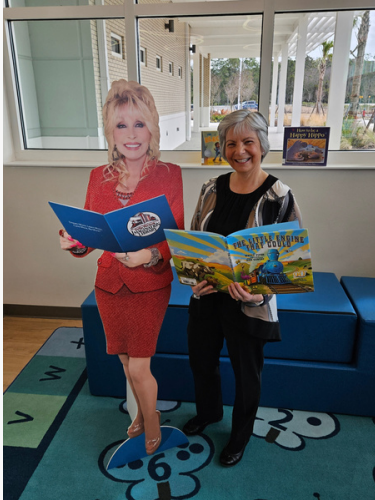
